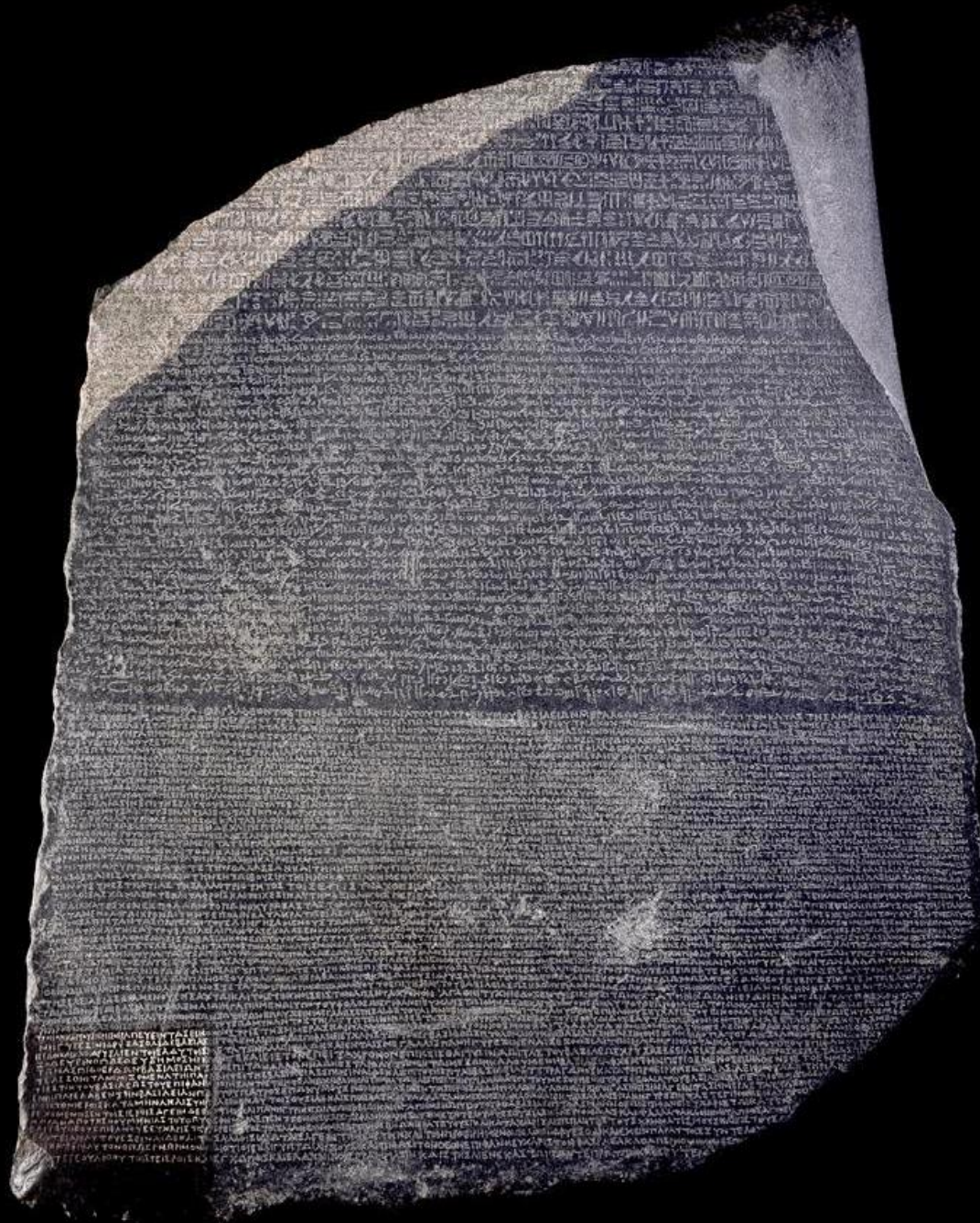

Hawara, Egypt, 12th Dynasty, 1855–08 BC.





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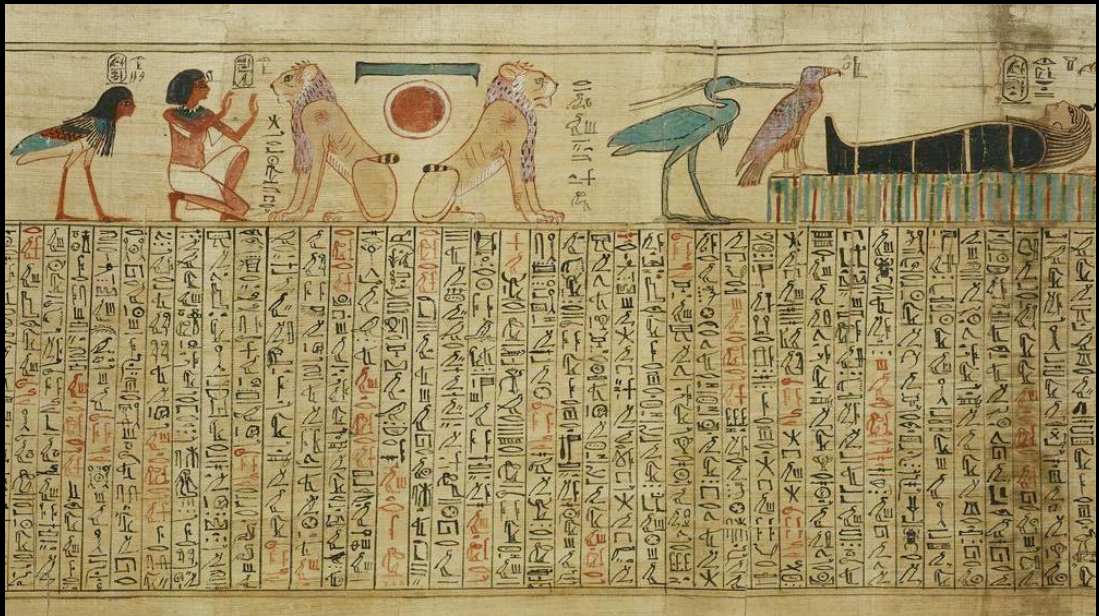
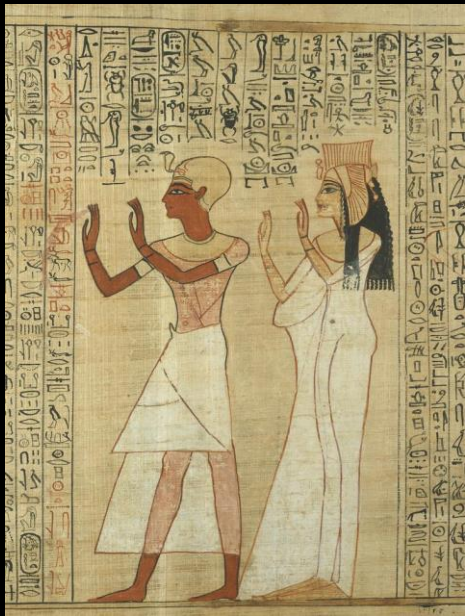

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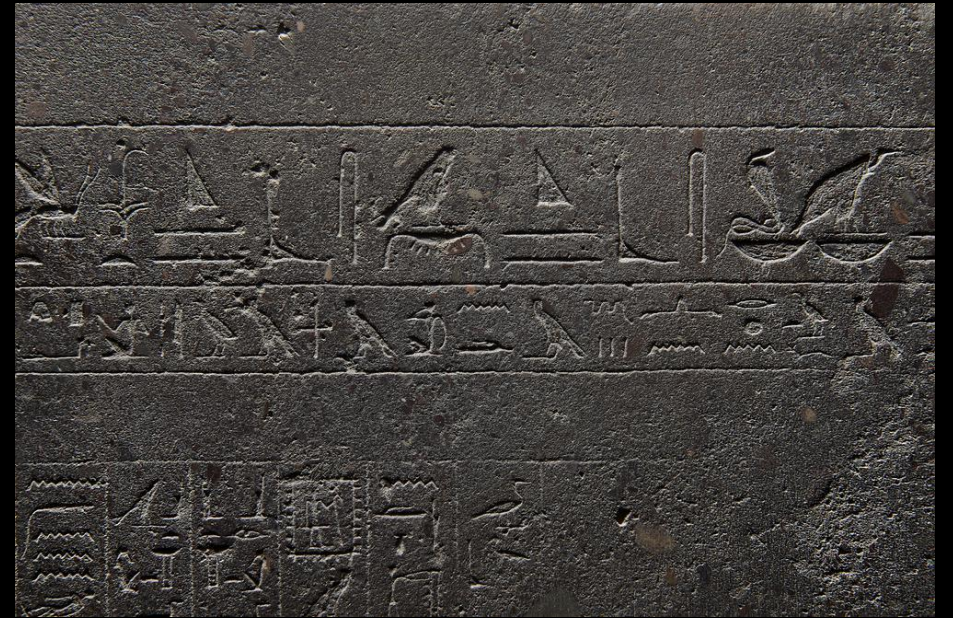
